I. Call to Order and Flag Salute

The meeting was called to order at 7:31 p.m. by Board President, Tim Rogers.

II. Notice of Announcement

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, the Rockaway Borough Board of Education has provided adequate written notice of the time, date and place of this meeting to the Daily Record and The Citizen.

III. Roll Call

Administration Present: Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Patrick Tierney, Lincoln School Principal, Phyllis Alpaugh and Business Administrator/Board Secretary, Joseph P. Hurley Jr.

IV. Superintendent's Report

1. Principal's Reports – Ms. Alpaugh discussed the events that took place in the Lincoln School and Dr. Tierney discussed the events that took place at Thomas Jefferson School during the past month.
2. Pre-school Tuition – The Board discussed the tuition prices for the 2012-2013 school year. They decided to charge \$2,500 for parents living in district and \$9,500 for schools looking to send students here.
3. Nurse's Reports - Dr. Tierney discussed the nurse's reports.
4. Enrollment – Current student enrollment is 663.
5. Legislative Updates – Dr. Tierney discussed changing the election date to November and the Urban Hope Act.
5. School Calendar – The Board discussed the 2012-2013 school calendar.
6. Facilities – Dr. Tierney informed the Board that both boilers in the Lincoln School went down and needed emergency repairs. Due to the age of the boilers, it was recommended to have both repaired at the same time.
Dr. Tierney explained due to the costs of repairs to the boilers and unanticipated special education tuition, Mr. Hurley will send an email about a spending freeze to the staff.
7. Board to Board Meeting – Dr. Tierney informed the Board that Jim Jencarelli, Superintendent Morris Hills Regional, asked if the Board would like to attend a Board to Board Meeting on January 24. No one was available.
8. NJQSAC – Dr. Tierney informed the Board that Eleanor Jaick will be in district on January 27 to discuss how the district can earn more points in the curriculum section of NJQSAC.
9. Hall of Fame – Ms. Alpaugh reported that there were no new applications.
10. American Diplomas Project – Dr. Tierney discussed.
11. Michelle Lockwood – Dr. Tierney asked if our staff would perform a presentation at the NJ Council for Inclusive Education summer conference. The presentation is related to the positive behavior support program that was created and implemented in the Rockaway Borough Schools this year.
