- Ms. Clark- 66 West Flagge St., Rockaway NJ- asked about the camp that Mr. Onischuk is running over the summer. She asked if running the camp is a conflict of interest and if fees would be charged. The answers were given by Mr. Graf and Mr. Grieco. They responded that we have done research with the board attorney, insurance broker, and other districts. There are no fees in the current policy for use of fields and he does not need custodians. If custodians are needed, there will be a charge for that, based on the policy. The response also included telling Ms. Clark that the policy itself also should be updated.
- 2. Ms. Clark- 66 West Flagge St., Rockaway NJ- asked about the potential of a church land sale. Mr.Graf responded that the church approached the board about selling land for a project that they are looking to do. This project has never fully been considered, because there are too many obstacles in the way to consider at this time for the board to even consider, including state approval and the cost of various items needed to even explore this possibility.
